# **Parish Statistics**

## Fiscal Year July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017

The generous sharing of the gifts of time, talents and treasures by our parishioners enable our parish to carry on Christ's mission of spreading the Good News of God's love and care.

Welcoming - We welcomed 78 new families to our parish last year-after adjusting our census to account for those who moved, transferred or went home to God, we now have 1,423 active households. The number of persons who are included in households on the parish registry is 3,993. We continue to welcome new member of our Hispanic Community as well; currently we have 98 registered families.

Faith Formation – We had 117 students enrolled in our parish Faith Formation Program (pre-school through Gr. 6). A dedicated staff of 31 FF teachers and helpers made the children's programs possible. Adult Faith Formation included two Parish Missions, Bible Study groups, Family Sacramental Preparation Retreats, Women's Faith Sharing, and a Sunday Scripture sharing group. A variety of spiritual enrichment materials were also available for selfstudy in the church vestibules and Faith Formation information racks.

Youth Ministry - There were 23 students (Gr. 7-8) in our Jr. High program that included religious education and community building activities, retreats and lock-ins. There were 48 students in our High School program (Gr. 9-12). Highlights included the ACCY Convention, social events, and service projects. Our Young Adults gather with Star of the Sea Young Adults for Faith sharing and social events.

<u>Liturgy</u> - Many of our parishioners serve as liturgical and sacramental ministers: Ushers, Greeters, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Lectors, Altar Servers, Musicians and Instrumentalists. All assisted our clergy and the Liturgy Commission in providing prayerful and meaningful liturgical celebrations throughout the year. We bring the Word of Life and the Body of

Christ to the ill and confined members of our community through Eucharistic Ministry outreach by taking Holy Communion to the hospitals, nursing homes, adult care facilities, and homebound and celebrating Communion services at area nursing facilities. Mass is celebrated monthly at The Willows.




# **Revenue and Expense Graphs**

## Holy Trinity Highlights and Happenings

Our Annual Catholic Appeal campaign for 2017-2018 goal is \$130,756. As of November 29, 2017 a total of 380 families pledged \$128,078. The amount paid to date is \$100,024.

Our Building Committee has been working diligently and has completed the design for renovation the Church and is proceeding with development of construction drawings.

Our Capital Campaign Leadership team is working diligently on soliciting capital commitments necessary to accomplish our church renovation. To remodel our church building, our parish community needs to raise \$2.8 million. To date 391 families of our parish have committed \$1,832,545 and we have collected \$1,024,472. For the success of our Capital Campaign we need every parish family to participate in this three-year commitment.
